Are You or Someone on Your Team Ready to Lead Bismarck-Mandan?



New American Leadership Network Completes First Year

The first year of the Chamber EDC's New American Leadership Network, created in partnership with Bismarck Global Neighbors, was recently completed and successfully supported 13 participants by helping them build confidence and connection as they establish their lives in Bismarck-Mandan.

Designed to be flexible and responsive, the program asked applicants about their interests and needs, then developed monthly sessions tailored to those topics. Throughout the year, participants explored leadership and civic engagement, local history and culture, entrepreneurship, financial literacy, health care access, childcare and education, nonprofit resources, and



systems like taxes, insurance, and employee benefits.

Internship Network Survey Results

We surveyed the 2024 participants of the Chamber EDC Internship Network to better understand the program's impact—and the results were clear. An impressive 94% of interns said the events helped them build connections with other interns in the community, and 94% also felt they learned more about Bismarck-Mandan through the program. A strong majority shared that the resources provided at each event played a meaningful role in helping them feel more informed and engaged with the place they lived and worked all summer long.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

As part of our ongoing efforts to keep members informed on policy developments that impact workforce and business growth, we're highlighting two key outcomes from the 2025 Legislative Session. These initiatives reflect meaningful progress on talent development and employer support—two areas critical to the long-term success of Bismarck-Mandan's economy.

SB 2019 – Department of Career and Technology Education

The 2025 Legislative Session delivered significant wins for workforce development with the passage of SB 2019. This bill allocates \$3.25 million toward workforce training programs, directly supporting the upskilling of North Dakota's talent pool to meet evolving industry needs. It also invests \$1 million in virtual reality career exploration tools, giving students and job seekers immersive access to career pathways in high-demand fields. The centerpiece of the bill is a \$75 million investment in a Statewide Career Center Initiative Grant Program —an ambitious effort to expand access to handson, career-focused education throughout the state.

SB 2282 – New Income Tax Credit for Employer Child Care Contributions

A new tool is now available to help employers support their workforce while reducing tax liability. SB 2282, passed during the 2025 Legislative Session, creates an income tax credit for businesses that contribute to employees' childcare expenses. Employers can claim a credit equal to 50% of their total contributions—up to \$1,000 per employee annually. This legislation is a meaningful step toward addressing one of the most pressing workforce challenges in our region: access to affordable, reliable childcare. It not only helps working parents stay in the labor force but also empowers businesses to enhance recruitment and retention efforts through family-friendly benefits.
